



## Certificate of Achievement / Associate Degree Program **DENTAL ASSISTING**



### About This Program

Dental assistants perform a wide range of duties in dental care facilities, from patient care to office tasks and laboratory procedures. Students become skillful at taking X-rays and impressions, as well as performing coronal polishing and assisting with an array of dental procedures. The program covers patient preparation, charting, administrative duties and office administrative functions. Students gain hands-on experience during lab class sessions and clinical experience. Upon completing the program, graduates of the program at the California campuses are able to apply for and take the State of California Dental Board examination for licensure as a Registered Dental Assistant (RDA)\*.

This program culminates in a Certificate of Achievement or Associate of Science degree in Dental Assisting.

### General Education Coursework

Students in Carrington College's certificate programs complete technical coursework and participate in a career development seminar.

### Technical Coursework

The Carrington College Dental Assisting curriculum begins with a broad base of knowledge on subjects ranging from anatomy of the head and mouth to sterilization techniques to front-office operations. Students' progress to learning specific skills and building their understanding of dental procedures performed in dental offices. As they near the end of their studies, Dental Assisting students complete an externship.

To be eligible for entrance into the Boise campus Associate of Science degree program in Dental Assisting, applicants must have earned a Certificate in Dental Assisting from a program accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation (CODA).

- Take radiographs (X-rays) on clinical patients
- Demonstrate the ability to apply critical thinking, work collaboratively, communicate clearly and act professionally
